SOVIET JEWRY

A few weeks ago Iosif Mendelevich was in Britain. At the talk I heard he shared one of his experiences in the prison camp. Relieved to find another Jew in the camp he made contact and the younger man was eager to learn from Iosif who taught him Hebrew and Jewish history through the sewage pipes connecting the cells. Released into the labour camp the lessons continued and a Rosh Hashanah celebration was held. The two men sat with a piece of bread and a postcard of Jerusalem that losif had received long ago. For this they were punished; put into solitary confinement in the prison of the prison camp. They went on hunger strike and still continued the lessons. Iosif wrote down all he remembered on tiny scraps of paper which he hid in the snow during the exercise half-hour and the other collected them and learnt them to be tested in the evening through the plumbing. "That's what kept us going", he said. "There's a little spark of G-d in all of us Jews".

These were recent experiences - he has been is Israel less than a year. It is very difficult to believe that such things are going on now. The news from Moscow is that all Hebrew teachers' homes have been raided and they have been told that it is now forbidden to teach Hebrew. All activists will have to stay in Russia all their lives and will not be permitted to emigrate. In one year, the KGB threatened last week, there will be no more Jewish activity, or any other dissident activity.

It is imperative that we remember the spark that Iosif Mendelevich talked about. Not only must we pray that it is not extinguished physically or spiritually but we must continue our efforts on behalf of the Jews of Russia. I hope you will all find time to write letters to the Jews in Russia to let them and the authorities know that we will never forget them.

SAFEGUARDING THE JEWISH MARRIAGE

I am making this contribution as Chairman of the Jewish Marriage Council. I believe that there has never been a time when this Council was so important to the well-being of our community. The institution of-marriage is, at the moment, in a state of crisis and that state of crisis is having a profound affect on the Jewish community. I do not have to elaborate on the enormous increase that has taken place in marriage breakdown in recent years. Colleagues everywhere must testify to this fact. The Jewish Marriage Council puts the focus clearly on the subject of Jewish marriage and the support of the community for its work is vital. The work of the Council can be generally divided into three parts. They are: marriage preparation, marriage guidance and after-care. In the marriage preparation section, by far the most important and most successful of our endeavours are the teach-ins that we organise for engaged couples. I am happy to say that these are growing in popularity and serve an extremely useful purpose. For six weeks couples come together in an informal atmosphere and discuss every aspect of married life. Hopefully after participating in such a course, they are reasonably well prepared for the challenges that marriage inevitably provides. Within the marriage preparation orbit we also have a department which deals with teenage children at school and at club and as an adjunct to the teach-in, we organise classes in cookery and home management.

The lecture department makes sure that organisations throughout the metropolis and outside are informed about our work and are stimulated by lectures on subjects such as Jewish attitues to "sex and marriage", "the generation gap", "marrying in/marrying out" and "communication in marriage".

The department for which the Council is best known is the Marriage Guidance Department. Unfortunately, the work load of Counsellors in this department increases all the time and they counsel couples from every section of the Jewish community. It should be stressed at this point that the Jewish Marriage Council has extremely stringent regulations with regard to our selection and training procedures, so that only Counsellors of the highest callibre, and who are willing and able to attain high professional standards, are accepted for our work.

In using the term "after-care' I had in mind that department which counsels those whose marriages have, unfortunately broken up. The Get department was set up with the intention of persuading recalcitrant spouses not to refuse to grant or receive a Get. In this respect the department has been remarkably successful but now the activities of it are much wider in nature. Divorced people who apply are counselled and the department has co-operated with the Beth Din in a major publicity drive to ensure that the Community is aware of the need for a Get.

Our Council is based in London, but, in the past year a major step in its development has been the opening of a branch in Manchester and in the immediate future, moves are being taken to set up a Communal Marriage Bureau and in this we will depend largely on the co-operation of Ministers through the country.

The Marriage Council is involved in vital work appertaining to the welfare of the Community and we are happy to co-operate with Ministers in all their endeavours in this field.

LIGHT OBSER WATTONS

In assessing the significance of light, we find illumination in the main is, by the present generation, taken for granted.

Merely by pressing a knob, button, or switch, or perhaps the somewhat older method of striking a flint or matchstick, light is produced. It must however be remembered that the use and need, and indeed importance of flame and light was of great significance as far back in the history of man as one can go.

The uses of artificial light were varied and diverse. For example, great fires were lit to convey information over great distances, particularly in times of conflict some thousands of years ago, and even in more recent times - and to make one further point, the act of lighting a flame to mark or commemorate an event of some importance was performed by people of various races and nations, even to this very day.

Regarding our own Jewish history, we have occasion to commemorate by the kindling of lights, a number of events past and present. The commencement of the Sabbath is marked by the blessing and lighting of candles. Likewise the termination of the Sabbath, the Havdalah is the ceremony marking the end of Sabbath and consists of blessings over wine, spices and flame. The flame is obtained by lighting a many coloured plaited waxen taper. The blessings refer to the distinction of light and dark, noly and profane, and between working days and the day of rest - the Sabbath.

Then again the Eternal or Perpetual light, normally hanging high in front of the ark in Shul and kept burning as a symbol of the radiance of faith, faifh in Judaism. In ancient days, the days of the

Tabernacie, fire was perpetually kept alight on the altar and he doubt served to kindle other lamps at the end of the Sabbath.

Another reason for giving light is when a person dies and close relatives are in mourning. Candles are lit in the house of mourning during the seven days of Shiva. The lighting a candle in memory of the deceased is then continued by the bereaved on the same hebrew date each following year and the Kaddish prayer is recited by the male mourners.

However, it is not only on mad occasions that illumination takes place. The celebration of marriage is marked by lighting and brightening the happy event and the ceremony is marked with lights and candles all aglow and continued through to the wedding feast.

Now we come to the Memorah. The ordinary Memorah usually consists of a seven-branched candelabrum. Going back in ancient history, the Golden seven-branched candelabrum was one of the most prominent features of the Temples and Tabernacles of that era. The term Memorah also applies to the Chanukah lamp, which has eight branches and a centre stem which is known as the Shamas.

After the destruction of the Temple the festival of Chanukah was linked with the miracle of the small amount of oil which remained alight and continued to burn for eight days. Chanukah also commemorates the victory of Judah the Maccabee over Antiochus Epiphanes.

Of course there are other instances in our history where flame and light is incorporated into the rituals and customs we embrace. And, in assessing again the significance of light, we may thank G-d for the many benefits we derive from the Power of hight and the Gift of Sight.

PALESTINE is not a country that was arbitrarily carved out of nowhere. It has boundaries which for centuries were recorded and imprinted on the memory of mankind. When its political identity was restored at the end of World War 1, the boundaries of Mandatory Palestine were internationally approved because they corresponded with those of the historical and geographical land of Palestine, reaching from the Mediterranean in the west to the borders of Iraq in the east.

And when THE TRANS-JORDAN PROVINCE OF PALESTINE® was given a separate local administration under the Emir Abdullah, it became the part of the country reserved for Arabs: their Palestine.

In 1946, this region became an independent state. Abdullah wanted to call it "The Hashemite Kingdom of Palestine" and it was only because British officials persuaded him to choose a different name, pointing out that the Jewish as well as the Arab inhabitants of the country were known as Palestinians, that it became Transjordan, later Jordan.

But, what's in a name? The fact that the land and the people remained as Palestinian as they had always been was frequently stressed by prominent Arabs.

"PALESTINE IS JORDAN AND JORDAN IS PALESTINE; THERE IS ONE PEOPLE AND ONE LAND, WITH ONE HISTORY AND ONE AND THE SAME FATE." This was said by Prince Hassan, the brother of King Hussein, when he addressed the Jordanian National Assembly on February 2nd, 1970.

Similar statements and credos abound. Even as recently as 24th September 1980, Marwan al Hamoud, a member of the Jordanian Consultative Council and former Minister of Agriculture, publicly stated in Amman:

"JORDAN IS NOT JUST ANOTHER ARAB STATE WITH REGARD TO PALESTINE BUT, RATHER, JORDAN IS PALESTINE AND PALESTINE IS JORDAN IN TERMS OF TERRITORY, NATIONAL IDENTITY, SUFFERINGS, HOPES AND ASPIRATIONS, BOTH DAY AND NIGHT."

The case presented here concerns the search for a just solution to the Palestinian problem in the circumstances of today.

Israel, within its pre-1967 borders, occupies 17.8 per cent of Palestine; the West Bank and the Gaza Strip together amount to 5.3 per cent, and the remaining 76.9 per cent belong to the Kingdom of Jordan.

Supposing it were generally agreed to give the Palestinians an independent West Bank / Gaza entity — cramming all those who might want to live there, as well as the area's existing Arab population, into the tiny enclave between Israel's pre-1967 border and the River Jordan, plus the Gaza Strip — is this a viable and feasible proposition? And is it compatible with the concept of justice, considering that such a plan ignores the Palestinian identity of the three-quarters of Palestine which is Jordan?

Here is a Palestinian land which is able to absorb millions of people and in which the overwhelming majority of citizens are Palestinians in the truest sense of the definition, indeed by any definition — and here is the world looking at that small, populated fraction of Palestine's territory as the *only* place for Palestinian national self-expression and as the *only* homeland for those unfortunate Palestinians who are still in refugee camps.

The West Bank and Gaza Strip must be given their proper status. But that issue and all the others connected with Palestine would fall into place and could be settled relatively easily if Jordan were accorded its rightful role as one of the main components of Palestine.

The process towards a just and viable peace settlement has to be based on correct and logical assumptions, otherwise it will be doomed to failure.


